Objective:

Financial Math is an elective math course designed to prepare students for successful money management in their personal lives. Eight major topics will be studied including: payroll management, budgeting, banking, credit cards, major purchases (retail and home), taxes, and personal investing.

Expectations:

Students are expected to:

- 1) Be on time and prepared for class.
This means having all assignments done ON TIME!
- 2) Be respectful at all times during class.
- 3) Bring their *TI-83 Plus (or higher)* calculator EVERY DAY.

Grading:

- 1) Class Assignments (20 Points **Each**). This will be the majority of a student's quarter grade. Any assignment not finished in class must be completed at home that night.
- 2) Quizzes (100 Points) (usually given once a week)
- 3) Class Participation Grade (100 Points).

Homework:

While most of the course work will be done in class, certain instances will require homework assignments. More often, students will be asked to bring in a paystub, loan application, etc for the next day's lesson. It is imperative that all homework assignments be done on time, and all items requested be brought in on the correct day in order to keep up with the class lesson schedule.

Extra Help:

Extra Help is available every day after school from 2:02 until 2:30.

Absence Policy:

I follow the school's policy as far as number of absences allowed, and every 3 "late-to-class" being converted into an absence. If a student misses a day, it is their responsibility to visit the website for any assignments due, etc. If a student is absent on the day a project is due or on the day of a quiz, it must be made up the next school day to avoid penalty.
